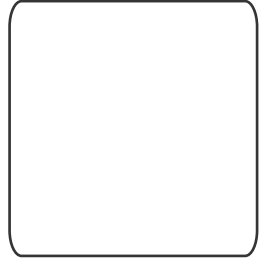

RULES & REGULATION

1. The school day commences with assembly at which all students are expected to be present.
2. All students should be habitually clean and always neatly dressed on all school days, the school uniform is to be worn.
3. Running, shouting and whistling is not allowed inside the school complex.
4. No student leaves the school premises without the permission of the Principal.
5. Habitual idleness, irregular attendance, disobedience or mis conduct, injurious to the moral tone is sufficient for expulsion of a student.
6. Care must be taken on all school property. No student should spoil the desks, chairs or any other furniture, writing or drawing on the walls or damage any other thing belonging to other students or the school, any such damage is to be made good by the student who does it.
7. No books (other than text books), magazines, pictures etc are to be brought to the school.
8. School will not be held responsible in any way for the loss of their personal property. Valuable articles should not be brought to school.
9. Bringing electrical gadgets like cell phones, cameras etc, is strictly forbidden.
10. All students should take part in keeping the school clean. No waste papers are to be thrown over the classroom windows.
11. EIS students should have polite behaviour, speech and manner at all times. They should greet their teachers when they meet them.
12. Parents and guardians should not visit their wards or teachers in the classrooms without the permission of the Principal.
13. All the students must speak in English within the class and school premises. English conversation as far as possible should be maintained at home.
14. Cycles must be kept locked and parked in the cycle stand.
15. Non sikh boys should get their hair trimmed at intervals. Hairstyle, gel, spiky hair, hair colouring are not allowed.
16. Students will not be allowed to ride the motor-cycle or scooter in the school. Parking outside school is also not permitted.
17. Eatables cannot be delivered by parents/other during school hours.
18. Students will remain home when they are sick. Once they come to school, they will remain for the entire school hours. This rule applies even during the time of examination.
19. All students are expected to be in the school by 7-50 a.m. during the summer and 8-20 a.m. in the in winter. Those who reach before the bell should remain in the class rooms and study silently. Late comers will not be permitted to attend the school.
20. The interpretation of any rules of the school as well as any amendments to its rules solely and entirely is with the governing body of the school. This shall be final and binding on parents/guardian and in respect of their decisions.

BUS RULES

1. All the students should obey the respective staff monitors, the drivers and conductors of their buses.
2. Staff/Monitors should check the entry of a new person in his/her bus.
3. Any quarrel/fights and disputes, should be reported to the concerned authority of the school, the bus in-charge, Principal at the earliest. Indiscipline behaviour in the school bus will make the student ineligible to use the school transport.
4. In case of any mishap in the bus, please inform the school office immediately. **(Ph.: 98766-07740)**
5. Misbehavior in the bus, violence in school individually or in a group and damage to property is considered a major disciplinary violation. Reports of violence in any form in the school bus shall result in the rustication of the pupil concerned.
6. Safety Saves. So students should avoid traveling on footboards and any unnecessary movement in the bus.
7. Travel in the bus is only permitted after the permission of the concerned authority.
8. Students are advised not to get on/off the bus while it is moving, or at the traffic signals/crossings etc.
9. Bullying, use of foul language and carrying objectionable material are punishable offence.
10. Student has to fill bus application form if they want to avail bus facility.
11. If a student wants to discontinue the bus service (only in case of non avoidable circumstances). He/she has to fill the bus closure form.
12. **Kindergarten to Class-II** Students will be brought back to the school if parents/.guardians are not at their stoppage.

The Educational Rights of the Minorities

GUIDELINES FOR EXAMINATION

Examination is an evaluation process where a structured system evaluates formal learning. Equipose and equanimity go a long way in successfully attempting your test paper.

- Calmly Prepare for your test/exams at home. Catch a good night's sleep and ensure that you eat something nutritious of your choice before coming to school.
- It is important for you to be dressed properly in your complete school uniform.
- Bring your complete pencil box with all needed examination accessories. Borrowing is not allowed.
- Keep your bag/books or any other material outside the Examination Hall.
- Read your entire question paper before starting to attempt it.
- Do not get jittery or upset after a glance of the question paper.
- See the marks allotted to each question and then work and allot time to the questions.
- After completing your paper, please revise thoroughly.
- Underline all important lines/headings.
- Do not talk to a fellow student in the examination hall/centre.
- Number your extra sheets and tie them in the serial order.
- You will not be allowed to leave the examination hall/ centre during the examination hours.

RULES FOR THE LIBRARY

1. Library cards will be issued to the students of class VI and above.
2. If the library card is lost or damaged, in the case, he/she will be imposed a fine of Rs. 20.
3. The Library opens from Monday to Friday 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. daily. Students of classes IV and above use the recess and their assigned library periods for reading books and magazines and avail of the expensive and up-to-date reference facilities. The Librarian is available all the times to answer queries and cater to the information needs and requirements of the staff and students.
4. Students are expected to behave in responsible manner within the library premises and in vicinity. Anyone guilty of disobedience to the librarian or of disorderly conduct renders himself/herself liable to suspension from the use of the library.
5. The procedure for borrowing the books for home reading is as follows:
 - A student may borrow one book at a time for a period of one week and is solely and entirely responsible for the care and conditions of the book borrowed in his/her name.
 - The name of the borrowers and the title of the book must be duly registered on the book card and the borrower's card respectively and must tally with the date return marked on the date slip before the books can be taken out of the library.
 - The attention of the librarian must be immediately drawn to any book that an intending borrower find damaged, disfigured or mutilated.
 - A book may not be kept beyond a week. If a book is not in demand and there are no pending requests or reservations, it may be re-issued for another week by the same borrower.
 - If a student fails to return the books borrowed by him at the end of the week, a fine of Rs.1/- per day is levied for the time the book is overdue and each day the fine remains unpaid.
 - A student who loses or damages book or magazines will have to replace it or bear the cost of the replacement of the same book. Due fine will be charged until book is replaced
 - All books must be returned two weeks before the beginning of each terminal examination.
 - A borrower who fails to do so will be fined until the book is returned.
 - Reference books and magazines are only for learning in the library and cannot be borrowed.

GOOD PARENTING SKILLS

1. Parents are encouraged to spend quality time with their children everyday.

3. Inculcate in your child the reading habit. Encourage your child to read library books and buy them books incentive.

ADMISSIONS

The School Academic year begins in the month of April and culminates at the end of March of the following year inclusive of summer vacations.

1. The Management reserves the right of admission.

4. All documents presented at the time of admission will be retained by the school and become the property of the school and will not be returned.

Admissions to Class XI

1. The right of admission is vested with the Management.
2. Provisional admission to class XI will be done after class X Board examination, based on the performance of the student in class X and Pre-Board Examination.
3. Before admitting the students, the school will advise them to take up streams suitable for them depending on their previous performance, through personal contact and counselling and career guidance.
